# **Onwards and Upwards!**

After the tremendous success of our Centenary season (which included, among other delights, the world premiere of a clarinet quintet specially commissioned by ICMS from the composer Sebastian Black, and a Gala Concert featuring an unforgettable performance of Mendelssohn's Octet), we move on with renewed vigour and a great deal of optimism for the future of our distinguished Society.

This season we are celebrating the music of Bartók – the 80th anniversary of whose death falls in 2025 – with two of his string quartets (25 Oct & 17 Jan). There is also a fair amount of French music in the mix, with familiar and notso-familiar works by Debussy, d'Indy, LeClair, Milhaud, Poulenc and Ravel, while our second all-Baroque concert (14 Mar) promises to blow our socks off with its dazzling programme of concertos including J. Bach's incomparable Brandenburg No. 5.

As usual, all these concerts take place in the ideal acoustics of Great School (the main hall) at Ipswich School. Audience members are welcome to park for free in the school grounds – see overleaf for a map and directions – but please note that the number of spaces is limited, so you need to arrive in good time if you want to take advantage of this facility. We encourage people to join the Society by buying season tickets, which continue to offer excellent value for money, and we also have a Friends scheme for those who wish to support ICMS financially.
